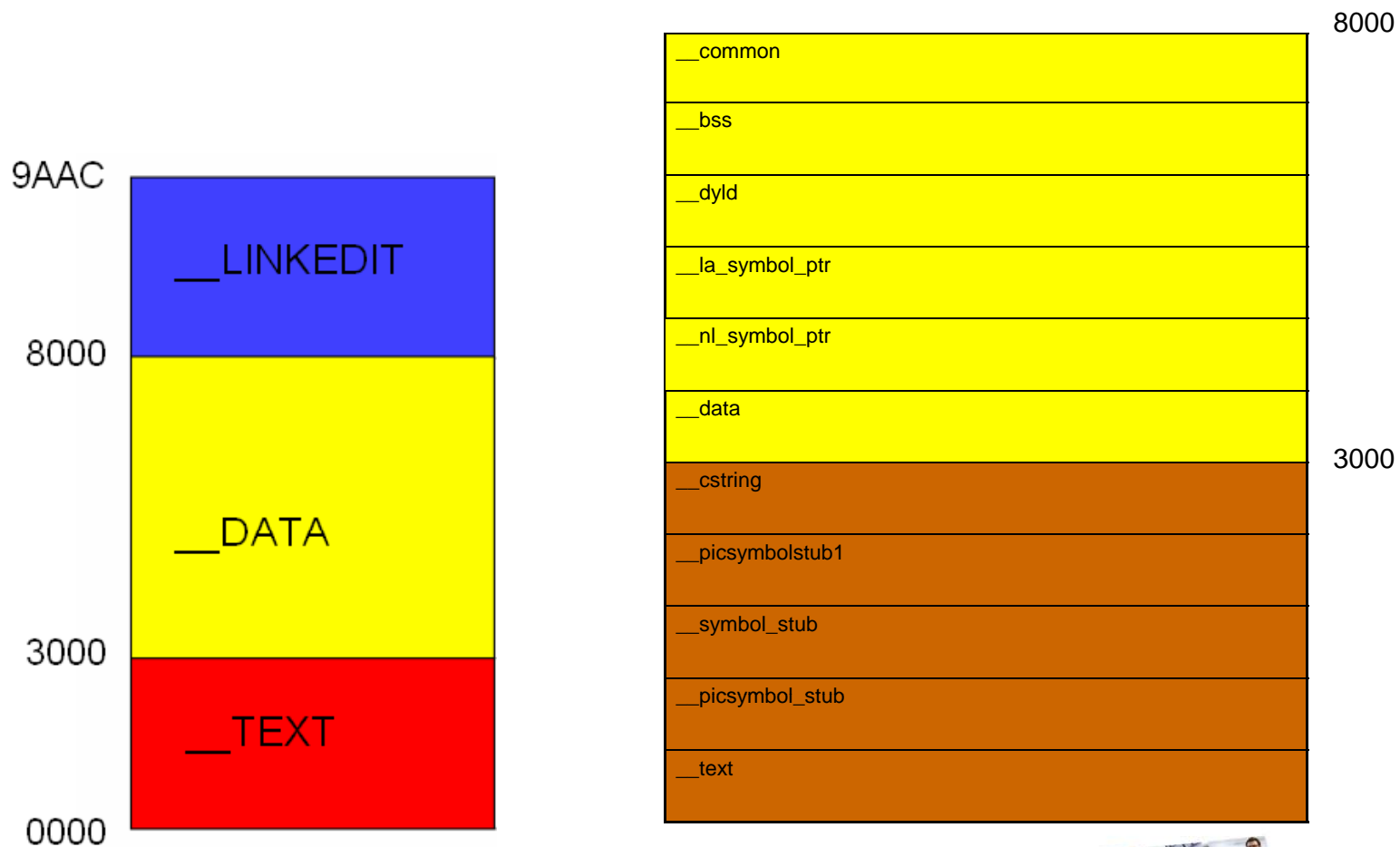

Possible Virus Techniques for OSX Mach-O Files

- No EP in Mach Header
- Change the immediate bytes at the start or the end of the executable code itself in the `__text` section
- Or by putting a call instruction in these to another section where the real virus bytes reside.

- CFNetwork is a framework in the Core Services framework that provides a library of abstractions for network protocols. These abstractions make it easy to perform a variety of network tasks, such as:
 - Working with BSD sockets
 - Creating encrypted connections using SSL or TLS
 - Resolving DNS hosts
 - Working with HTTP, authenticating HTTP and HTTPS servers
 - Working with FTP servers
 - Publishing, resolving and browsing Bonjour services

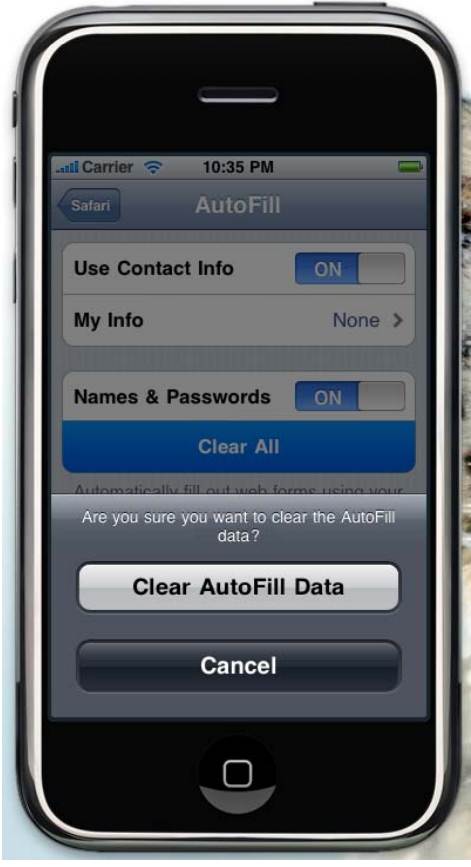
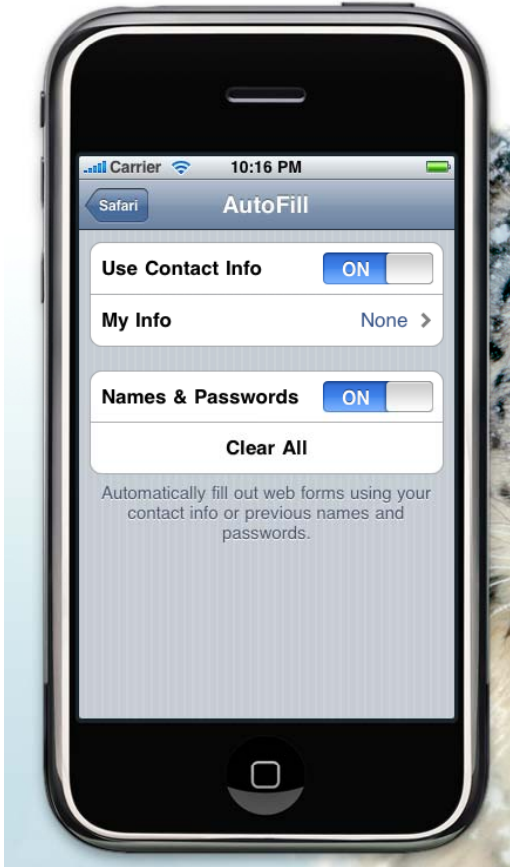

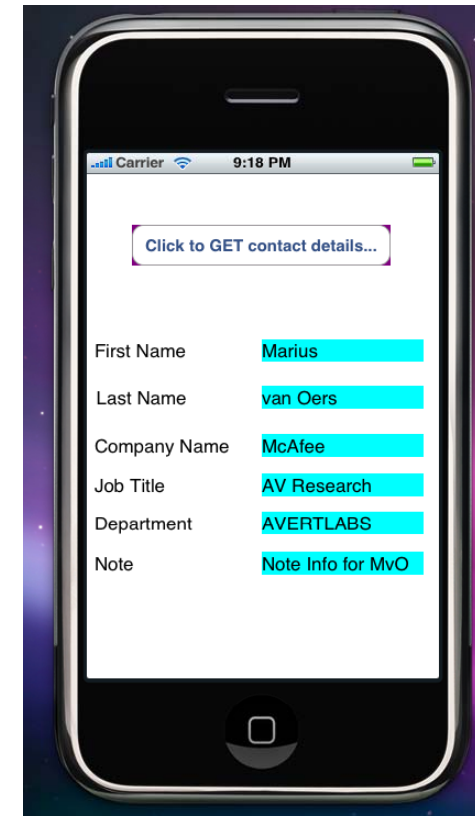

- In September 2006 Apple shipped some iPod devices that actually had a malicious 32 bit PE binary file, `ravmone.exe`
- Trojan might allow remote control and might call various weblinks.
- Not Native for Apple
